Possible Issues- Subjects for interviews – Questions

100 students are selected from each school for Project Works- There are 5 Social Topics for each School-Students are divided into Teams of three - 6 to 7 Teams are assigned to each Topic.

Each Team should select one Issue of the Topic and Prepare 8 to 10 Questions for Interviews

Each Team should do Maximum 15 Interviews- 6 Interviews near school.

Each Team Members doing 2 interviews near school and 9 interviews near homes

Preparation of Questionnaires

Each Team of 3 Students should prepare their Questionnaire together - Questionnaire should have Two Parts-

Part- I: Date and Time of Interview- Name- Gender – Address – Education -Profession

Part – II: Questions on the Topic and Issue selected

- 1. About 5 Questions are given for each Issue- Students should add 3 to 5 questions to finalise
- 2. Questions should be framed with care so they do not hurt the Subjects
- 3. After the Questions are finalized, Students should prepare 10 to 15 copies for use in the field for the interviews
- 4. Enough space should be kept between questions to record the responses of the Subjects
- 5. Interviews can be taken in English / Telugu / Urdu / Hindi as comfortable to the Subject
